In each activity Wilma did an outstanding job of tying BSSD standards to her cultural activity. **Wilma has high expectations for each student, and she would not accept anything less than the student's best.** Wilma decided to teach because she enjoyed working with the three- and four-year-olds at Headstart. From there she decided to move up to teaching at the Elementary level to continue to help the students learn.

**Wilma also took education seriously in her own life, and spent many years pursuing an AA degree in General Education through long-distance education, finally receiving it in 1989.** Wilma gave tirelessly of herself, spending long hours creating lessons, working with classroom teachers, helping students on cultural activities and much more.
